We also offer level 3 qualifications in Early Years Education & Care, Health and Social Care and Specialist Support of Teaching and Learning in Schools.

These level 3 courses are currently FREE to under 24s who do not already hold a level 3 qualification, and also FREE to under 19s if BAES is your main learning provider.
